

# D6 Everyday @Home Bundles

## How to lead your family in discipleship with D6 Everyday @Home Bundles

1. *D6 Everyday @Home bundles* include a Devotional Magazine (print or digital) for each member of your household (parents can share a copy if they choose to)
  - Digital devotional magazines are accessed in the D6family app.
  - Share the devotion magazines with your family members ( or access in the D6 Family app)
  - Notice the devotions are dated or numbered, so start on the same day to help connect and create conversation (Every age on the same page so to speak).
  - You'll also receive a pdf of a Teaching Guide appropriate to the age of your youngest child or younger children (it will be easy to adapt your Bible study and activities to include older children and teens).
2. The Teaching Guide is provided for you to have ample resources to lead Bible study in your home.
  - You can follow the lesson plan as the Teaching Guide lays it out or pick and choose the parts that work best for their family.
  - Additional downloadable resources (e.g., Parent Pages and Splink) are available at [D6Home.com](https://D6Home.com).
  - You can even download a [Measure What Matters Home Chart](#) so everyone in the family can encourage each other in their daily disciplines.
3. Find a routine that works with your family schedule for discipleship.
  - Be intentional in how you schedule together-time as well as how you capture the teachable moments that pop up.
  - Find ways to utilize the time you're already together (e.g., around the dinner table, while you're driving somewhere, tucking in bed at night, etc.).
  - Studies show that discipleship is most effective when there is biblical engagement at least four times a week, so encourage each other to be diligent in doing the daily devotions.
  - Sit down with your younger children and help them do the devotions and the other activities in their devotion magazine.
  - Be sure you're checking in with your older children about their daily devotions - ask questions to open conversation around what they're reading, what they'd like you to pray with them about, and how God is impressing their hearts; be sure you share with them as well.
  - Develop your own approach to Bible study that includes your children and encourages active engagement with the Bible text and each other.
  - Use your imagination, change it up from time to time, be creative, and don't let Bible time become routine or boring.

- Don't forget the value of dads and moms reading the Bible together, discussing it, and praying together without the children (plan for your individual devotion time as well as your family devotion time).
